They spoke out in one voice proclaiming liberty throughout New England. I agree with the patriotic zeal exhibited by these ministers, in spite of the fact that I cannot agree with some of their theology.

The pulpits of this nation are regrettably silent today on the subject of liberty. We have taken our liberties for granted and the loss of a few more seems to go unnoticed in the light of the many liberties we have in this country.
