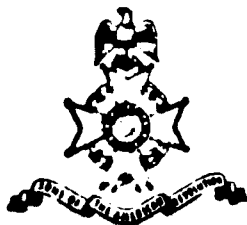

SHORT BIOGRAPHY

RONALD K. WRIGHT, M.D.

Dr. Wright obtained his bachelors degree in Biology and Chemistry in Springfield, Missouri, at Southwest Missouri State University. During college he was employed as a medical technician, a Deputy Sheriff, and an emergency medical technician. He attended medical school at St. Louis University during which time he was a clinical chemist and toxicologist for St. Louis University hospital and the St. Louis Medical Examiner's Office. He did his internship and residency in anatomic, clinical and forensic pathology at the University of Vermont where he was also Deputy Chief Medical Examiner for the State. From 1974 to 1980, he was Deputy Chief Medical Examiner of Dade County, Florida. During that time he attended the University of Miami Law School and was admitted to the Florida Bar in 1980. Since November, 1980 he has been the Chief Medical Examiner of Broward County.

Currently, he is Associate Professor of Epidēmiology and Public Health and of Pathology of the University of Miami School of Medicine.

He has lectured at numerous homicide, crime and such institutes. He has written numerous articles in the scientific literature in the field of forensic medicine.

He is a Fellow of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences and on the Board of Directors of its foundation, a fellow of the American Association of Clinical Pathologists and past Chairman of its Forensic Council; he is a fellow of the College of American Pathologist and on the Forensic Committee, he is a past member of the Board of Directors of the National Association of Medical Examiners and is certified by the American Board of Pathology in anatomic, clinical and forensic pathology.
