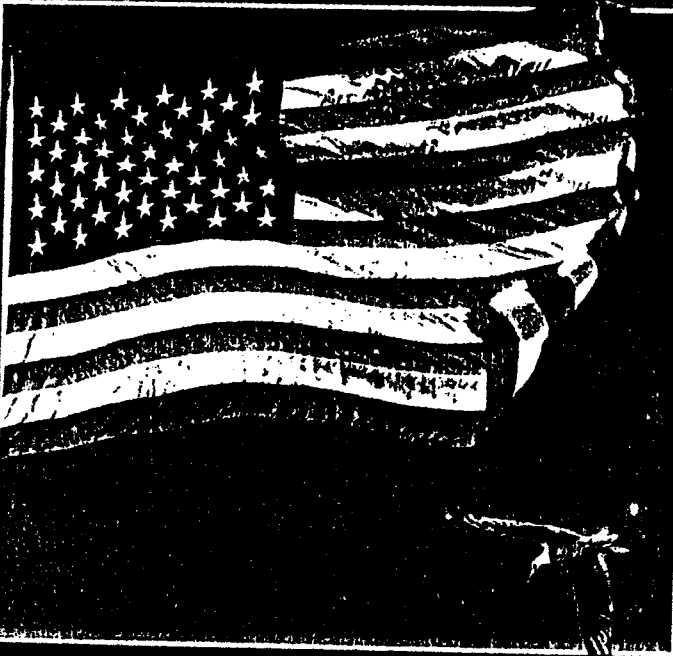
REMEMBER THAT JULY 4TH IS INDEPENDENCE
