FLAG DAY - JUNE 14, 1986

The design of stars and stripes was adopted by Congress on June 14, 1777, and some first displays of the United States flag were:

July 2, 1777 - by John Paul Jones, on the ship Ranger, at Portsmouth.

August 2, 1777 - over Fort Stanwix, New York.

September 3, 1777 - At Cooch's Bridge, 14 miles southwest of Wilmington, Delaware.

September 11, 1777 - At the Battle of Brandywine, the United States flag first flew in offensive land warfare.

January 28, 1778 - On Fort Nassau, Bahama Islands, when the Americans captured the fort from the British.

LEST WE FORGET !

June 17, 1775 - It cost the British 1,054 of their soldiers to win the Battle of Bunker Hill.

June 28, 1776 - American troops repulsed the attack on Charleston.

June 28, 1778 - The British retreated from Philadelphia, and Gen. Washington fought a drawn battle at Monmouth.

June 20, 1780 - At Ramseur's Mill, 400 patriots defeated 1300 North Carolina Tories.

June 6, 1781 - American forces took 600 prisoners while recapturing Augusta.
