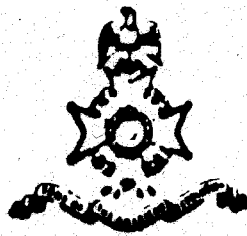

November 11th is the date of the signing of the Mayflower Compact. If there are Mayflower Society members present, invite them to say a few words.

November 11th is also Veterans Day. Any new members who are veterans should be recognized, and other members should be asked if the SAR War Service medal has been awarded, if eligible.

November 19th, recalls to memory Lincoln's " Gettysburg Address". Remember the healing words that started with " Fourscore and seven years ago"?

And the last time someone called you a " turkey "----- on Thanksgiving Day, recall Ben Franklin, who wrote " I wish the bald eagle had not been chosen as the representative of our country; he is a bird of bad moral character; like those men among us who live by sharpening and robbing, he is generally poor, and often very lousy. The turkey is a much more respectable bird, and withal a true original native of America".

The Panama City Chapter met on October 5th, for what may be a "first" for that Chapter! The meeting was held aboard a Navy ship docked at the Port Authority. A tour of the ship was conducted by the host, Commander Thomas L. Breitinger, member of the Panama City SAR Chapter.

The Charlotte Chapter scheduled a meeting on Friday 13th ! The plan was to have a Social Studies expert from Charlotte County Schools to inform members regarding the teaching of American History in public schools. (Think about a similar program for your Chapter.)

Another Friday the 13th meeting took place in Pensacola to discuss reactivation of that Chapter. On August 14, 1559, Don Tristan de Luna, a Spaniard, led a group of 1,500 settlers to the shores of Pensacola, establishing the first European settlement in what is now the United States. Two years later, the settlement was abandoned. In 1896 the Chapter was formed by Lt. John Henry Bull and fourteen others. From 1896 to October 1930, it was the Florida Society and Pensacola Chapter combined as reported in the newsletter.

Saint Lucie Chapter met on October 14th with Regional Vice-President Russ Ford, as guest speaker. (Topic was not recorded in Chapter newsletter.) At the September 20th joint meeting with the DAR Halptiokee Chapter, the guest speaker was Ms. Ann Decker, District Coordinator of Public Information for the Honorable Tom Lewis, U.S. House of Representatives.

Suncoast Chapter had Ida Register, a long time resident of Florida, who spoke on "Outstanding Women of the Revolution". She is Past Regent of Boca Ceiga Chapter, DAR; Past State Recording Secretary, DAR, and Past State President, CAR.

Born in Miami, Florida on April 19, 1939, he is married to the former Emilie Costar. They have four children: Mimi, Jennifer, Clay III and John Charles (J.C.).
