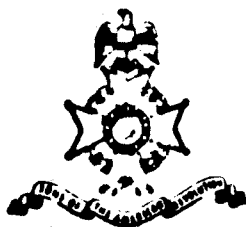

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Harry Calevas is a man of many talents and unlimited energy. He is an author, inventor, management consultant, hotel chain operator and real estate broker. For thirty years, he has been actively engaged in property management either directly or as a consultant which makes him uniquely qualified to write this handbook of condominium management. He studied management engineering at Case Institute of Applied Science in Cleveland, Ohio, and since graduating, he has applied his management skill to the problems inherent in the operation of hotels and many other businesses.

Calevas holds patents on a wide variety of items, from furniture to electronics. Probably best known is his "turntable", a chair which converts into a table, or a table that converts into a chair, whichever way you look at it. He is the inventor of a canned food item familiar to every G.I. in World War II, and most recently, he invented a modular fast food service restaurant that utilizes a combination of microwave, steam and infra-red systems of reconstituting pre-prepared, pre-packaged food for the super-highway traveler.

Calevas has operated several of the largest and finest hotels in America and attracted national attention by his unique system of operation. His numerous articles on scientific management have appeared in many trade magazines. He wrote two technical books on hotel management, "Positive Way to Profit", and "Mathematics of Profit Making," which were very popular in the trade.

During World War II Calevas was captain of large cargo ships and tankers with sufficient harrowing experiences that could be the subject of another book.

In recent years, Calevas has concentrated on Real Estate sales and management, specializing more particularly in condominium development and management. He is in great demand as an advisor to many condominium boards of directors and spends considerable time traveling around the country. During this period he has found that many managers, directors and owners are in need of a guide to effective condominium management. The result is this handbook in which he shares his experience with those who wish to obtain detailed knowledge of condominium operation.

Harry Calevas resides in Florida. He is President of the Florida Board of Trade, President of Certified Building Managers, a charter member of the Executive Manager's Association, a member of the Boca Raton Board of Realtors, and many other business and professional associations.




